

FOOD WORKS AT TWO RIVERS CENTER
CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

NAMING OPPORTUNITIES

This architecturally impressive farmhouse is a two-story Greek Revival building with significant exterior and interior features. The farmhouse and adjoining kitchen wing and small barn show the evolutionary development of connected buildings, common throughout New England. In addition, this design is “an important regional contribution to American architectural history,” according to Historic Preservationist Liz Pritchett. The connected buildings once framed a barnyard and kitchen garden sheltered by immense cottonwood trees, many of which are still standing.

The interior features are considered to hold the greatest architectural significance, including the door and window surrounds with elaborate and varying moldings, along with ornate fireplace mantels, triple-hung floor to ceiling sash with paneled reveals, elegant stair railings and newel post and a floor plan that remains relatively unchanged.
